

At the meeting of the Ridgeway Town Board held on <u>December 19</u> 2016, Councilman <u>Joffersy Tous 2010 T</u> moved adoption of the following resolution; Council 2014 Council 2014

"RESOLVED, that in accordance with the New York State Environmental Quality Review (SEQR) regulations, the Town Board of the Town of Ridgeway hereby suncources its intent to serve as Lead Agency to conduct an environmental review of the construction of public water supply improvements to serve the proposed Water District No. 14. The proposed action involves the installation of approximately 20,600 linear feet of waterline along portions of Culvert Road (County Roads 35 & 72) and Porter Road in the Town of Ridgeway. The project will provide public water to properties that are currently dependent upon individual groundwater supplies that historically have produced very low yields of poor quality water.

FURTHER RESOLVED, the Town Board has determined that, as portions of the project are located within an Orleans County Agricultural District, the proposed action is a Type I action as defined under SEQR; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, the Town Board has commissioned LaBella Associates DPC to prepare Part 1 of the Environmental Assessment Form regarding the project.

FURTHER RESOLVED, the Town Board will notify the Involved Agencies of its intention to act as Lead Agency for this project and will provide them with a copy of the completed Part 1 of the full Environmental Assessment Form for review during the 30-day comment period.

> RESOLUTION CREATING THE TOWN OF RIDGEWAY WATER DISTRICT NO. 14 IN THE TOWN OF RIDGEWAY, SUBJECT TO PERMISSIVE REFERENDUM

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Ridgeway (herein called "Town Board" and "Town", respectively), in the County of Orleans, New York, has, pursuant to Town Law Article 12-A, caused Chatfield Engineers, P.C., competent engineers duly licensed by the State of New York, to prepare a preliminary map, plan and report for the establishment of Water District No. 14 (the "District"); and

WHEREAS, such map, plan and report is on file at the office of the Town Clerk, and available for public inspection at said location; and

WHEREAS, such map, plan and report proposes the installation of approximately 20,600 linear feet of 8-inch water main along various road in the Town, along with the installation of valves, hydrants and appurtenances and the connection to existing water mains in the Town, as well as other such improvements as more fully identified in (or contemplated by) such map, plan and report referred to above, including all related right-of-way costs, new service installation, site work and other ancillary work, preliminary costs and other improvements and costs incidental thereto, and in connection with the financing thereof (collectively referred to herein as "Water Improvement"); and

WHEREAS, as stated in such map, plan and report, the project has an estimated maximum cost of \$1,054,000, which amount is to be financed by the issuance of serial bonds in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$1,054,000, such amount to be offset by any federal, state, county end/or local funds received including, but not limited to, grants funds in an approximate amount of \$598,000 expected to be received from the United States of America – Rural Development Agency, and unless paid from other sources or charges (including, but not limited to, water rents), the cost of the Water Improvement will be paid by the assessment, levy and collection of special assessments from the several lots and parcels of land within the proposed District which the Town Board shall determine and specify to be especially benefited thereby, so much upon and from each as shall be in just proportion to the amount of the benefit conferred upon the same, to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds as the same shall become due and payable, except as provided by law; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board may establish water rents as provided in paragraph (d) of subdivision three of Town Law Section 198; and

WHEREAS, the expected average annual cost to the Typical Property (as defined by Town Law) in the proposed District (which is a single family home) during the first year will be approximately \$689.92 (such amount includes construction financing costs (debt service) and estimated annual water usage costs); and each property will also have to provide for service from their home to the property line and internal plumbing modifications (as applicable) to set a meter and valves at an estimated one-time cost of approximately \$1,375 (actual costs will vary depending on the actual length of the service line and the complexity of installation); and

WHEREAS, the Town Board has pursuant to an Order Calling for a Public Hearing, which Order was duly posted and published, held a public hearing on December 19, 2016 to consider the creation of the proposed District, at which hearing all members of the public were given an opportunity to be heard.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF RIDGEWAY as follows:

The Board hereby determines:

- That the notice of public hearing was duly published and posted as required by law, and is otherwise sufficient.
- That all properties and property owners benefited by the improvements are included in the proposed District.

- That all properties and property owners included in the proposed District are benefited thereby.
- 4. That it is in the public interest to establish the proposed District.
- That in the opinion of the Town Board, none of the properties included in the proposed District will be unduly burdened by the creation of the District.

RESOLVED that the Town Board hereby approves the creation of The Town of Ridgeway Water District No. 14 in the Town of Ridgeway and shall be bounded and described as follows:

Beginning at a point, said point being the intersection of the centerline of Porter Road (49.5' ROW) and Culvert Road (49.5' R.O.W.), and also being an easterly boundary of the Town of Ridgeway Water District No. 13; thence

- Northerly, 650 feet more or less, along the centerline of Culvert Road;
- Westerly, 500 feat more or less, along a line perpendicular to the centerline of Culvert Road and also being along a northerly boundary of the Town of Ridgeway Water District No. 13; thence
- Northerly, 4,725 feet more or less, along a line parallel to and 500 feet westerly of the centerline of Culvert Road to a point, said point being along a southerly boundary of the Town of Ridgeway Water District No. 3; thence
- 4. Easterly, 1,220 feet more or less, along a line parallel and 500 feet southerly of the centerline of Ridge Road (NYS Route 104) (90° R.O.W.) to a point, said point being along the centerline of Culvert Road; thence
- Northeasterly, 180 feet more or less, along the centerline of Culvert Road to a point, said point being a northwesterly extension of a northerly property line of Tax Account No. 59-1-11; thence
- Southeasterly, 200 feet more or less, along a northerly property line of Tax Account No. 59-1-11 to a point, said point being a northerly property corner of Tax Account No. 59-1-11; thence
- 7. Easterly, 480 feet more or less, along a northerly property line of Tax Account No. 59-1-1; thence
- Southwesterly, 5,730 feet more or less, along a line parallel to and 500 feet easterly of the centerline of Culvert Road to a point, said point 500 feet northerly of the centerline of Porter Road; thence
- 9. Easterly, 6,375 feet more or less, along a line parallel to and 500 feet northerly of the centerline of Porter Road to a point, said point being along a westerly boundary of the Town of Ridgeway Water District No. 4; thence
- Southerly, 1,000 feet more or less, along a line parallel to and 500 feet westerly of the centerline of Knowlesville Road (49.5' R.O.W.); thence
- 11. Westerly, 6,925 feet more or less, along a line parallel to and 500 feet southerly of the centerline of Porter Road to a point, said point being 500 feet easterly of the centerline of Culvert Road; thence
- 12. Southerly, 5,240 feet more or less, along a line parallel to and 500 feet easterly of the centerline or Culvert Road to a point, said point being along a northerly boundary of the Town of Ridgeway Water District No. 10; thence
- 13. Northwesterly, 1,045 feet more or less, along a line parallel to and 500 feet northerly of the centerline of Portage Road (49.5' R.O.W.) to a point, said point being 500 feet westerly of the centerline of Culvert Road; thence
- 1.4. Northerly, 5,080 feet more or less, along a line parallel to and 500 feet westerly of the centerline of Culvert Road to a point, said point being along a southerly boundary of the Town of Ridgeway Water District No. 13; thence
- Easterly, 500 feet more or less, along a line perpendicular to the ceaterline of Culvert Road to a point, said point being the centerline of Culvert Road; thence
- Northerly, 355 feet more or less, along the centerline of Culvent Road to a point, said point being along the centerline of Porter Road; thence
- 17. Easterly, 380 feet more or less, along the centerline of Porter Road to a point, said point being the point of beginning.
- AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the estimated maximum amount proposed to be expended for such Water improvement is \$1,054,000, which amount is to be financed by the issuance of serial bonds in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$1,054,000, such amount to be offset by any federal, state, county and/or local funds received including, but not limited to, grants funds in an approximate amount of \$698,000 expected to be received from the United States of America Rural Development Agency, and unless paid from other sources or charges (including, but not limited to, water rents), the cost of the Water Improvement will be paid by the assessment, levy and collection of special assessments from the several lots and parcels of land within the proposed District which the Town Board shall

determine and specify to be especially benefited thereby, so much upon and from each as shall be in just proportion to the amount of the benefit conferred upon the same, to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds as the same shall become due and payable, except as provided by law; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution is subject to a permissive referendum; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk shall, within ten days after the adoption of this Resolution, publish a public notice at least once in each newspaper designated as the official newspaper of the Town for such publication, and post on the sign board of the Town maintained pursuant to subdivision 6 of Section 30 of the Town Law, in the Form of Exhibit A to this Resolution, stating the adoption of this Resolution subject to permissive referendum, and the Town Clerk shall cause to be prepared and have available for distribution proper forms for the petition requesting a referendum and shall distribute a supply to any person requesting same; and be it

FURTHER ORDERED, that if the time for filing a petition requesting that the matter be submitted to a referendum of the property owners expires without such a petition be filed, the Town Clerk shall file a certificate stating such fact in the office of the county clerk; and be it

FURTHER ORDERED, that if such petition is filed, after such referendum is held the Town Clerk shall file a certificate stating that a petition was filed and a referendum held and certifying the results of the vote on the proposition submitted at such referendum in the office of the county clerk.
